## WHO CAN CREATE AN ENDOWMENT FUND?

Any individual, couple, or family! So can friends, classmates, golf buddies, PTA parents and choir members.

## HERE'S HOW:

### Open a Fund

Donate or raise the \$5,000 needed to create an endowment fund with The Catholic Foundation of North Georgia.

### Pick a Beneficiary Organization

Your family or group gets to decide which organization or ministry will benefit from the fund. Your endowment can support a parish, a Catholic school, the homeless, youth ministry, a campus ministry, or more. Just decide which organization or ministry you want to help long into the future.

### Choose a Name

The new endowment will need a name. Endowment funds are an excellent way to memorialize a family member or a beloved teacher or priest. Funds are also named to honor respected individuals, alumni classes, even a patron saint.

### Grow the Endowment

The original gift of \$5,000 is invested to start growing towards the established purpose of the fund. When the fund total reaches \$25,000, the endowment will be able to provide its first distribution to the beneficiary organization and fulfill the vision of you and your group. You can help your fund reach that \$25,000 goal sooner by making a commitment of \$5,000 per year for four more years, for example.

# Diane Duquette

A LIFETIME OF SERVICE



## For Diane, her years at The Catholic Foundation have been a ministry of insight and service.

“It’s a ministry, not a service,” Diane says of her work in planned giving. “It especially needs to be available to the elderly and their grown children. These days some of those adult children don’t even know to call in a priest.”

Diane has visited all 10 of the deaneries and every one of the 69 northern Georgia counties that make up the Archdiocese of Atlanta.

“Every priest has heard who we are and what we do,” she says.

Sometimes it’s a quick process. A lady at St. Peter’s Church in LaGrange had heard Diane speaking at a senior meeting, and told her right then she was in need of some additional income. In less than two weeks, and entirely by mail, an annuity was arranged.

Charitable gift annuities can bring large tax deductions, provide a steady income, and later leave a gift to the fund of the donor’s choice at The Catholic Foundation.

Starting her career as a broker with Merrill Lynch in her native Birmingham, Diane opted for non-profit service and joined the planned giving staff of Birmingham Southern College, continuing at Dahlonega’s North Georgia College in development.

An artist and grandmother of three and an expectant great-grandmother, Diane is active in a Bible study group and a frequent pilgrim to the Shrine of the Most Blessed Sacrament in Hanceville, Alabama.

Recalling her work with the Archdiocese of Atlanta and The Catholic Foundation, she especially remembers disabled children and solitary old people – “people totally alone” – who were helped by proper financial planning and care.



“It has been a wonderful ministry, helping so many people create Catholic legacies which will help parishes, schools, and other Catholic entities in the Archdiocese for years to come,” she said. “I have met so many beautiful people.”

“We think of every person of means as being totally organized and ready,” says Diane, recently retired as our director of planned giving. “They’re not.”

Anyone interested in making a bequest, creating a fund, or otherwise benefitting The Catholic Foundation should arrange to have the following documents on hand.

- A will.
- A power of attorney.
- Advance directives in case you fall ill.

You should provide copies of the above documents to all your children, Diane advises. In addition, you should write out your funeral and burial plans for your children’s information. “Everyone will be glad you did,” says Ms. Duquette.

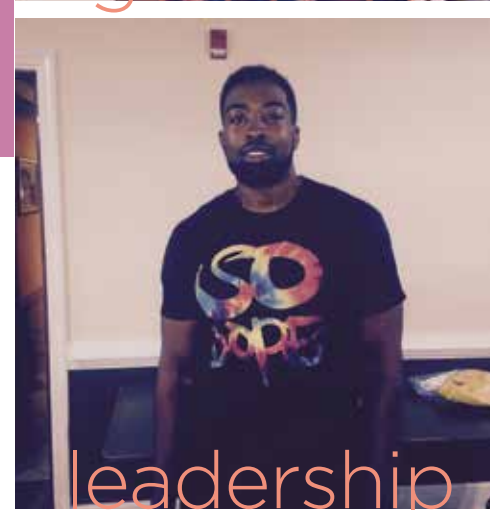
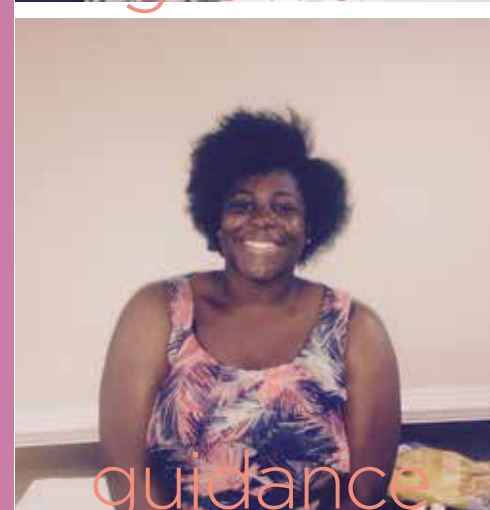
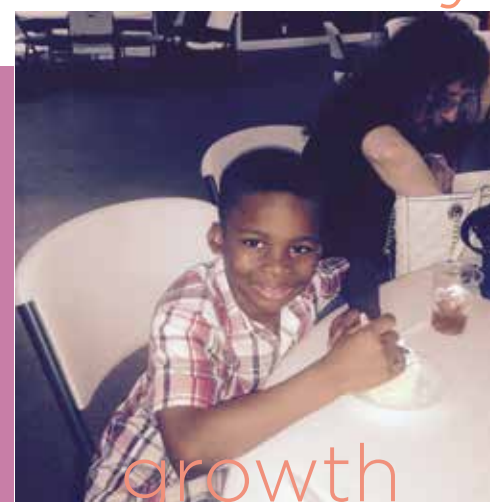

# Lithonia Youngsters Benefit from Foundation Grant

THEIR SCHOOL GETS OUT AROUND 3 P.M.

THEIR PARENTS DON'T GET HOME FROM WORK UNTIL 5 P.M.

THAT'S PLENTY OF TIME FOR A BORED CHILD OR TEEN TO GET INTO TROUBLE - AND UNFORTUNATELY, SOME DO.

According to Rev. John Paul Ezeonyido, pastor of Christ Our Hope Catholic Church, youth needs are especially keen in Lithonia. Many children and teens in the area find themselves home alone for many hours each day while their parents work. It's even worse over the summer and during school breaks. These children need to be engaged and cared for in a way that is consistent with our Catholic faith.

Recognizing this problem, Christ Our Hope decided to step in. Their volunteers created a safe place where children and teens from the community could gather after school, on weekends, and during summer holidays. There kids are given opportunities to learn, grow, and have fun, all while being nourished by the Catholic faith.

Middle school and high school students are the most at risk, but also the most difficult to engage. What makes this program unique is the leadership development opportunities and other classes offered – already successfully drawing in this usually reticent group.

To help implement this ambitious program, Christ Our Hope applied for a grant from The Catholic Foundation of North Georgia.

In the grant application, Father John Paul explained that the purpose of the request was “to support year-round mentoring, SAT prep classes, spring break activities, vacation Bible school, and leadership and talent development...for children and youth at our parish.” The goal of the program is to increase positive outcomes for youth in Christ Our Hope parish and the community at large “in the areas of character, relationships, academics, and service to others.”

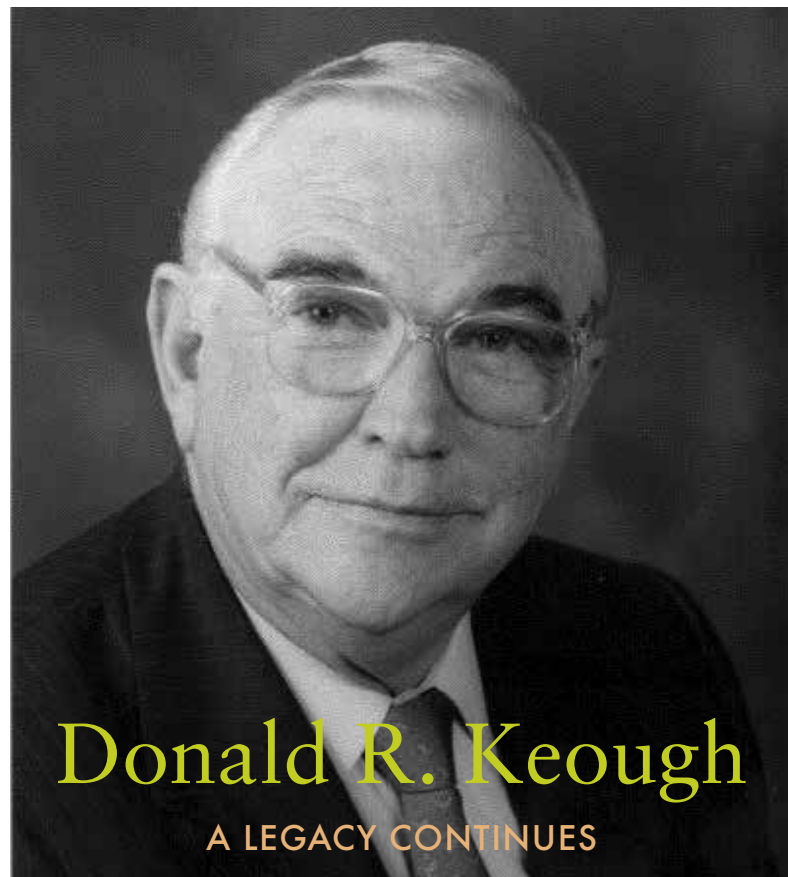
In the past two years, Christ Our Hope Catholic Church has received \$6,500 in grant awards from The Catholic Foundation to benefit this program. This funding was made possible by the Goizueta Fund at The Catholic Foundation.

Thanks to the support of our generous donors, approximately 80 children and teens in the Lithonia area now benefit from this program.

A LEGACY CONTINUES

It was Tuesday, June 30th, the last day of Fiscal Year 2015. And it was a good one for The Catholic Foundation.

A celebratory last day on the job for retiring Diane Duquette, director of planned giving.

It had been a good year and a great career.

Then, when an unexpected courier arrived with an envelope, the good day got even better.

Inside was a check from a trust fund set up by the late Donald R. Keough, lifelong Catholic, former president and COO of The Coca-Cola Company, and Chairman of the Board of Allen & Company, Inc.

Mr. Keough had passed away back in February at the age of 88. Always generous with his blessings and his time, he served on a number of boards and committees in support of Catholic organizations, including the original board of The Catholic Foundation of North Georgia. In recent years, his son Michael has carried on the family tradition as a member of our board and then chair.

### The check was for \$1 million.

It was earmarked for The Catholic Foundation Endowment, the fund that directly fuels the Foundation's operations and administrative needs.

"You do a lot of good helping other people give to what matters most to them and someone needs to help you," Michael Keough told executive director Nancy Coveny when she called to thank him for the gift.

This endowment is vital to the support and future of the Catholic Foundation. Here's why.

When Diane and Nancy first joined the Foundation in 2008 there were only 10 funds on the books. The Foundation currently manages 200. "This tremendous growth has been a blessing to our Catholic community, but it has also brought increased administrative costs and staffing needs," Nancy said.

The Catholic Foundation Endowment was too young and too small to provide much support. Until now.

That day, the staff was scheduled to go out for a retirement luncheon for Diane.

But first there was great rejoicing at the office.

Then they stopped off at the bank.



## Cleaning Out the Attic Leads to a Charitable Gift Annuity

FIND BENEFITS A SURPRISED COUPLE AND THE CATHOLIC FOUNDATION

While cleaning out their home in late 2013, Christ the King parishioners Jim and Jo Appleby had quite a pleasant surprise. They came across an insurance policy that had been purchased by Jim's parents at his birth in the 1930s. Purchased originally for just \$15, more than eight decades later, they would find the value of that policy had grown to nearly \$88,000.

The Applebys wanted to use the funds to honor the Church, a source of support and peace all their lives. However, the idea of extra income wasn't something they could just dismiss. A friend told them about the charitable gift annuities program at The Catholic Foundation.

The charitable gift annuities available through The Catholic Foundation exceeded the Applebys expectations. The couple was able to donate the entire sum, receive a quarterly income partially tax-free, and accrue just over \$41,000 in tax deductions.

The money from the insurance policy will eventually benefit three separate organizations' endowments at The Catholic Foundation of North Georgia for Cristo Rey Atlanta Jesuit High School, the Cathedral of Christ the King, and the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, Georgia.

It started as a \$15 insurance policy for an infant boy more than 80 years ago.

Now it will provide an additional quarterly income for the couple who discovered it and continue supporting the Catholic tradition in Atlanta for generations.
